Real Life Reflections

My grandfather was a chiseled complexity of a man. He had an exterior emotion as strong as steel but a heart as tender as an angel. Growing up with him meant that we were blessed with an unquestionable love. It also meant, as a member of the greatest generation, “Big Ed” as his friends called him or “Fafa” as the family called him, rarely cried.

One evening while helping me with a history project on the Vietnam War, we came across a photo of a vet leaning against the memorial in Washington D.C. weeping. Big Ed became frozen in his gaze. His body stiffened. With tears beginning to roll down his face, I will never forget his words, “Son, never forget we have freedoms in this nation because some men gave all. Never take it for granted. They were someone’s son, brother, father, husband, and friend.”

I never have forgotten those words, but I never have forgotten the emotion of that moment. In the silence that followed, the reality of war, the effect upon the men who fought, the confusion it brings to a nation, the emptiness of loss, and the inability to change the past was and still is overwhelming. Life became real to a twelve-year-old boy.

In Mark 15:34, we read what is the loudest cry of desperation ever recorded. There never has been and there never will be a greater display of God’s wrath. Jesus, God’s only begotten Son, after enduring the trial, the scourging, the crown of thorns, the weight of the cross, the nails driven through his hands and feet, and the torture of hanging on the cross, experienced the greatest agony. He had been led as a lamb to the slaughter and said not a word (Isaiah 53:7), but when the presence of the Father left him, he cried out. He screamed with an anguish no man has ever experienced in life. Anguish he, as God’s son, had never experienced. Complete separation from the Father as the sins of all humanity rested on his shoulders.

I am so glad the life of Christ did not end in defeat. Three days later he rose from the grave victoriously! I am so glad Big Ed at another time in my life, many times in my life, spoke often of this moment with tears rolling down his face. He found peace in the hope that Christ will one day set all things right. Fafa possessed an eternal hope he would be with his Savior forever. His hope is now reality. His family rests in that hope!

Never take the gospel of our resurrected Savior for granted. Bring someone with you Sunday and expect the gospel to continue to redeem the lost. Come ready to worship in the power of spirit and truth because he is risen, he is risen indeed!
